As the calendar flips to February, I'm pleased to report that our recent major renovation projects in Gainesville are nearing completion. In the past 12 months, we remodeled a portion of first floor of the 725



building to accommodate our new Voyager MRI (more on it is included in this edition). Also part of that process was a renovation of the Central Lab. For those not familiar, both the MRI and Central Lab are located on the Broad Street side of the building, behind the Chick-fil-A. If you haven't checked out these new spaces, please stop by!

Once we finished that project, we began renovating a major portion of the third floor of the 725 building, including Imaging, which now has a much larger waiting area and new X-ray. You'll also notice an expanded waiting area for Adult Medicine/ Urgent Care, as well as creation of a "Fast Track" suite for Urgent Care. Both adult patients and pediatric patients (5:30 to 9:00 p.m. M–F only) will be able to access this space when they seek treatment for "simple" symptoms such as a sore throat, a stomach ache or an ear ache.

We thank our staff and providers, particularly those who had to relocate (sometimes more than once) to accommodate all of the changes. While inconvenient, we are excited about the final results and believe they will improve patient care and operational efficiency. And stay tuned for signage updates that we hope will improve patient access and navigation around the campus. TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATION

Over the past few months, we've added several new pieces of technology to improve patient care. Longstreet Clinic is home to the state's first **1.5T SIGNA Voyager MR System.** This revolutionary technology has a host of features to speed up and simplify imaging and enhance the patient experience.

"The Voyager MRI has a lot of patient comforts in mind," said Longstreet Clinic radiologist Scott Kellermeyer, M.D. "It's a much wider open tube so less of

the patient is inside the tube during the scan, meaning the patient doesn't feel as constrained as with traditional MR systems."

Benefits of Voyager MRI:

- Sharper Imaging
- Reduced exam times and rescans
- Enhanced patient experience through noise reduction, motion forgiveness and the elimination of breath holds

Another new technology available at Longstreet Clinic is a new diabetic eye screening for patients with diabetes. Diabetic eye screening is a key part of diabetes care. Those with diabetes are at risk of damage to their eyes from diabetic retinopathy that can lead to loss of vision. **RETINA VUE** is a tool that aids in detection of diabetic retinopathy.

"Currently we are using this tool to capture patients who have not had their eye exam in more than a year," said Vicky Trusty, LPN. "Our goal is not to replace

the ophthalmologist but to reach patients who do not currently seek eye care and encourage them to see an ophthalmologist should they have an abnormal screening."

The tool is handheld and the test takes less than 10 minutes. Care Management and Diabetic Education are working together to schedule patient exams at all adult primary care locations. "Eye exams do not have their own schedule but are considered part of the comprehensive approach we have taken in our care of our patients with diabetes," Trusty added.
