It also leads to a stronger healthcare approach for the providers, who get to actively support and advise each other. And while the main location is in on Longstreet Clinic's Gainesville campus, some of its providers also offer services in offices in Braselton and Demorest, meaning that patients can access the benefits of collaborative care in a location most convenient to them.
