Kingsley's commitment and personality made a big impression at the Neuroscience and Orthopedic Center, where he was just named employee of the quarter for the Clinic..

ADOLESCENT WEIGHT LOSS PROGRAM: DR. RICHARD PERFORMS FIRST SURGERY

The Bariatric Weight Loss Center at Northeast Georgia Medical Center (NGMC) recently completed its first adolescent weight-loss surgery. Dr. Robert Richard, bariatric surgeon with Longstreet Clinic, operated using the da Vinci robotic system. Adolescent patients as young as 15 years old in northeast Georgia have had access to a comprehensive weight-loss program since July 2023, when NGMC achieved adolescent surgery accreditation from the Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery Accreditation and Quality Improvement Program (MBSAQIP). The program offers a range of care from nutrition counseling and medical weight loss management to surgical options.

"An adolescent patient's journey to surgery often takes longer than it would for an adult patient," said Dr. Richard, who also serves as medical director for the Bariatric Weight Loss Center at NGMC. "We take extra care to ensure our younger patients, and their families, are well-prepared for surgery and committed to lifestyle changes."



The program is led by an experienced and caring team that includes a pediatrician, bariatric surgeons, dietitians, a pediatric psychologist, and an athletic trainer – all focused on helping adolescents overcome the dangers and long-lasting impact of obesity.

"The real key for parents is to act quickly when they realize their child is struggling with the disease of obesity," said Dr. Richard. "Research shows us that early intervention is more likely to improve long-term health."

ROBOTIC SURGEONS Achieve milestone



No one wants to have surgery, but if it is necessary, you want to know you have the absolute best options available in your care. That is why Longstreet Clinic surgeons are committed to incorporating technological innovations such as robotic surgery including the innovative the **Da Vinci 5 surgical system**. Northeast Georgia Medical Center in Gainesville became the first hospital in the state to add the system and our surgeons were among the first to utilize it last June, offering patient benefits like smaller incisions and shorter recovery times.

The Da Vinci 5, which provides the surgeon with 100% control of the procedure and offers more than 150 design innovations, has now been used in more than 500 surgeries at NGMC.

In the Da Vinci system, a surgeon's hand movements are translated into smaller, more precise movements of tiny instruments inside the patient's body.
